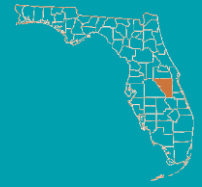

CURRENT CLINICAL SERVICES & PROGRAMS

Clinical Services:

Family Planning- Women's Health exams, pregnancy testing and counseling, screenings and access to FDA-approved birth control methods and supplies. Services available for males and females.

HIV Primary Care- Comprehensive primary care for enrolled HIV patients to include labs and referrals to specialty providers.

Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis (PrEP)- Antiretroviral medications provided to high-risk HIV negative patients to reduce the risk of HIV transmission.

Test & Treat- Immediate linkage to care for newly diagnosed HIV patients and those returning to care. Provide medical assessments, antiretroviral medications, education, case management and referrals to community services/resources.

AIDS Drug Assistance Program (ADAP)- Prescription medication and co-pay assistance for low-income people living with HIV.

Immunizations- Vaccinations for children and adults to include flu, Hepatitis A & B, pneumonia and HPV. Childhood (0 to 18) immunizations are provided at no cost to the patient.

Sexually Transmitted Infection (STIs)- Testing, counseling, treatment and partner notification services to persons infected with or suspected of being infected with STIs.

Refugee Health- Health assessments, vaccinations and referrals provided to refugees, asylees, Cuban/Haitian asylum applicants, Cuban/Haitian entrants, Amerasians, Afghan and Iraqi Special Immigrants, and certain victims of severe forms of human trafficking.

Tuberculosis (TB)- Coordinated care (to include testing and treatment) for persons with active TB disease, their close contacts and for latent tuberculosis infection (LTBI).

Programs:

Breast & Cervical Cancer Program- Screenings (pap smears and mammograms), care coordination and referrals for diagnostics as needed.

Emergency Preparedness & Response- Develop all hazards response plans in collaboration with community, city and county partners. Exercise and evaluate community plans. Provide support, medical care and guidance during disasters.

Environmental Health (EH)- Conduct inspections and/or issue permits/licenses for biomedical waste, body piercing and tattoo establishments, tanning salons, septic tanks, pools, mobile home parks, wells and migrant camps. Respond to all reported animal bites and sanitary nuisance complaints.

Monitor and regulate food hygiene practices in institutional settings. Investigate foodborne and water outbreaks in restaurants. Conduct safety and sanitation inspections in group care facilities.

Epidemiology- Infectious disease education and consultation to providers and community groups. Monitor, investigate and coordinate reporting of communicable diseases/conditions. Prenatal Hepatitis B Prevention Program for family members and contacts of prenatal and postpartum women who are positive for Hepatitis B.

Health Promotion- Health education programs and activities to promote healthy babies, families, employees and lifestyle choices.

Healthy Start- Home visiting program offering support services to at-risk pregnant women, infants and children up to age three. Provides information, referrals and ongoing care coordination to ensure access to needed services such as psychosocial assessments; nutritional and smoking cessation counseling; and childbirth, breastfeeding and parenting support/education.

School Health- Annual hearing, scoliosis, and growth and development screenings provided for required grades with follow-up on abnormal screenings. Vaccination clinics are offered for 6th graders to ensure compliance with the state requirements.

Tobacco Prevention- Resources and presentations on tobacco use prevention and cessation classes offered within the community. Work with community partners to create tobacco free policies. Facilitates Students Working Against Tobacco (SWAT) activities which mobilize, educate, and equip Florida's youth to promote anti-tobacco messages.

Vital Statistics- Certificates for persons whose birth or death occurred in Florida. Provide guidance to obtain birth and death certificates outside the State of Florida. Partner with the Tax Collector to offer birth certificates at certain locations.

Women, Infants & Children (WIC)- Provide healthy foods, nutrition education and counseling, breastfeeding support, and referrals to health care and community resources at no cost to eligible participants.
